





starting around 7 a.m. Our annual feast, in addition to honoring our traditions, is a trade fair that has a history going back centuries, when we traded with other Indian tribes and later with non-Indians. UNESCO has recognized Taos Pueblo for its living culture, which we continue to practice as we have for centuries. We hope you will be able to visit and join us on these joyous occasions. *Kee nah soo Goo yah!* Let's all have an enjoyable time!



What were the most important events of New Mexico's first 100 years of statehood? YOU CHOOSE! ✓

□ 1916 - Pancho Villa's troops raid Columbus. A massive Punitive Expedition into Mexico, headed by Gen. Black Jack Pershing, ensued. It involved the first tactical use of aircraft. A state park museum in Columbus tells a good story. □ 1926 - Route 66, the much celebrated "Mother Road" from Chicago to Los Angeles, provides many people with their first view of New Mexico and gave tourism a big boost. □ 1928 - Oil is discovered near Hobbs. The Spanish had found insufficient gold, silver and copper to make New Mexico worth much to them, but oil soon became New Mexico's biggest moneymaker. □ 1930 - Dr. Robert Goddard is convinced by Charles Lindbergh to move his rocket testing	□ 1944 - Navajo Code Talkers distinguish themselves for development of unbreakable code. □ 1945 - More than 100 Nazi scientists and engineers, along with V-2 rocket parts, shipped to Alamogordo Bombing Range, which became White Sands Missile Range, in what was known as "Operation Paperclip." White Sands ranchers, removed from their property in 1942, will remain permanently disposed of their land. World's first nuclear device exploded at Trinity Site. □ 1946 - U.S. Rep. Georgia Lusk, D-Carlsbad, was the first woman elected to statewide office. Members of Congress ran at large. □ 1947 - Roswell Army Air Force Base issues news release claiming it captured a flying disk. □ 1950 - Smokey Bear rescued from forest fire	
to the vast expanses of New Mexico. His many successful experiments earn him the title "father of rocketry." 1934 - It is said that during the Great Depression, the newly incorporated Town of Taos started the Fiestas for Santiago (St. James) and Santa Ana (St. Anne.) 1940 - Milton "Doc" Noss claims to have discovered a huge storehouse of gold at Victorio Peak, very near what is now Spaceport America. The Army later closed the area for Alamogordo Bombing Range. Noss never could retrieve the gold he claimed, but stories have persisted of government excavation of the hill. It became a topic of the Watergate hearings. 1941 - New Mexico National Guard activated and shipped to the Philippines.	in Lincoln County. Becomes national symbol. ☐ 1960 - Interstate highway system begins in New Mexico. Brings many more tourists.	
	☐ 1966 - New Mexico's fourth capital building dedicated. Nicknamed "The Roundhouse." ☐ 1973 - Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta inaugurated in a dirt parking lot. Has grown into the world's largest and most photographed	
	ballooning event. 1974 - Very Large Array telescope system begun on St. Augustine Plains, near Socorro. 1988 - Waste Isolation Pilot Plant opened	
	near Carlsbad to handle low-level transuranic waste. Safety record outstanding. 2005 - Spaceport America groundbreaking

a Reina de las **Fiestas** de Taos, Iuliette Elizabeth Rebekah Peralta, is 16 years old and will be a 2013 Taos High School graduate. She is an honors student and has been a member of Junior Senate, Student Council and the

New Mexico Association of Student Council.

"If I get to be Reina, I'll do my best to inspire young girls to run in future years," she said the day before the pageant. "I'd like to inspire boys too, so they become escorts."

Peralta is proud to be a member of the Our Lady of Guadalupe Church community and the youth group. She has been involved for many years in Los Pastores, a nine-day celebration and play that is performed each year in December, right before Christmas.

She plans to attend Adams State University to study child psychology



and orthodontics. "I'd like to become a pediatric dentist," she



Memories of Fiestas past

Notable figures relate to tradition and culture

iesta memories are created year round, but for Sonya F. Romero, member of the Taos Fiesta Council and royal pageant coordinator, her most memorable moments began the day she was proclaimed the 2001 Taos Fiesta Queen.

"I could never forget how proud my family was when my father, Adelaido T. Romero, crowned me during the official Fiesta Mass and the overwhelming emotions that filled my heart when the Entrega was sung," said Romero. She commented on the first time she led the traditional marcha-hop in 2002 with Don Francisco Trujillo II, and how timid she was. But as every Fiesta year passed, her confidence increased and now she leads the dance like a pro.

One interesting memory was the transformation of the queen's float. "As far back as I could remember every

queen from 2002, and even before, has built their float up from the base of a flat bed," Romero said. She added the float was transformed four times before its final design by José Coca in 2009.

Since her reign, Romero has also treasured memories of other royal courts. "In the 2007 pageant, La Reina Ana Alicia Romero recited a powerful poem about being a Taoseña; it brought tears to my eyes," she said. Another time, the 2010 court and council stayed in the famous Plaza Hotel in Las Vegas, N.M. "We had fun scaring each other after hearing stories of the ghosts that haunted the hotel," she said. Ultimately, Romero feels blessed for the continuous memories that each royal court has given her, filling her heart with laughter, love and camaraderie.

emcee for this year's pageant, enjoys taking part in the traditions that are unique to the Taos Fiestas. "I really like to participate in the Fiesta Mass and the marchas that take place during the local celebrations," he said. "But it goes beyond Taos; I also enjoy traveling to neighboring communities to celebrate their Fiestas and making friendships that last a lifetime."

Theresa Trujillo has been a council member since her daughter, LeAndra Medina, was crowned Reina de las Fiestas in 1992. "It was a wonderful experience watching her in the parade and seeing how other young girls looked up to her," she recalls. Trujillo also remembers how LeAndra's father, Manuel Medina, whose family owns the concrete plant Robert Medina & Sons, made a huge float with one of the company trucks. "We had the reina, the princesas and even the mariachis on the truck, as part of the parade," she said. "It was both memorable and fun."

Tanya Vigil, a third-generation Tasoseña, remembers that her mother and aunts waited for the Fiestas all year and had special dresses made for the occasion. "They would ride in from Ranchos to the Taos Plaza in a horse and a carriage

and shared with their friends the festivities of Santiago and Santa Ana," Vigil said. "Then they would go to Taos Pueblo and visit their comadres and compadres. The beauty of the festivities was that they included our American Indian, New Mexican and Spanish roots."

Joseph Quintana, the current council president, considers the Fiestas a special occasion for him and his family. "It's the perfect time to reconnect with friends that we see only once a year, during the celebrations," he said. "We get together and enjoy each other's company again." He decided to get more involved with the Fiesta Council in order to give back to the community and make sure that the Fiestas tradition goes on forever.

"My fondest memories of the Fiestas have to do with the celebrations in the Taos Plaza," he said. "That's where they started and they shouldn't move away from it."

The council strives to preserve the tri-cultural tradition of the Fiestas de Taos. "We have good company, music, culture, food and history, all together in one wonderful celebration," Quintana said. "The Fiestas are one of our richest cultural community events."



eacon Pat Delozier has expressed great honor and affection for having been chosen as the 2012 Grand Marshal of the annual Historical Parade of Las Fiestas de Santiago Y Santana. He extends his gratitude to the good people who make up and serve on the Taos Fiesta Council and give so much of their time and effort in preserving this great tradition.

Delozier came to Taos for the first time in 1960 and it was love at first sight. Finally in 1981 it was possible for him to move here, and Taos became his home. 



The 2012 Fiestas de Santiago y Santa Ana is lovingly dedicated to the memory of Frutoso A. López.

Frutoso López, who is remembered for being a respected and inspiring teacher, passed away Feb. 12 at age 62. Thanks to López, thousands of students who attended Taos Middle School during the past four decades learned to love math.

Jason Silva, a Taos Municipal School Board member who was a student of López, as well as his four children, said López was one of the district's strongest teachers.

"He had a way of pulling something out of a kid that most people didn't," Silva was quoted as saying in an obituary that ran in *The Taos News* shortly after López' death. "He made you like math. I was blessed to have him as a teacher."

Frutoso López graduated from New Mexico State University, where he earned his teaching degree. He taught at Taos Middle and High schools, retiring briefly at 2001, before returning a few years later. He also taught at the University of New Mexico-Taos. He

coached sports at the middle school.

Ernest López, who worked as a science teacher before his retirement, said he and his brother adopted the strong work ethic taught by their parents, Ernesto and Emelina López – to do the best they can and to not settle for mediocrity.

Frutoso López' method of teaching? The three Fs: firm, fair and friendly. Students said, "yes, sir" and "no, sir" in his class.

Frutoso and his brother Ernest were named Unsung Heroes by *The Taos News* in 2005 for their commitment to education.

Ernest López said his brother loved being outdoors. He and Frutoso would head to the Río Chiquito or Little Río Grande to fish.

Such fishing trips typically became a competition between the two brothers.

López is survived by his wife, Velma López, son Flavio López, and daughter Alicia López, his grandchildren and numerous siblings.

Since López' death, a memorial scholarship has been established in his memory at Centinel Bank.
